English	Create an information booklet on how to survive the Stone Age.	Imagine that you are a hunter gatherer, following herds of animals. Write a description of a day in your life.	Write a story about a Woolly Mammoth.
	Write a diary entry from the point of view of someone living in the Stone Age.	Research theories about the reasons why Stonehenge was built and write an account of them.	Create a fact sheet about a Woolly Mammoth or another animal that existed during the Stone Age.
Computing, History, Geography, Art, Design & Technology	Design and made a 3D model of Stonehenge. 	Design and create your own Stone Age home. 	Find out 10 facts about Stonehenge and present them using a method of your choice.
	Research what people ate during the Stone Age. Use the information you found to make a menu. Try making one of the dishes, take a photo or bring it in.	Draw or paint an image of what you would see if you stepped outside your Stone Age home. Think carefully about the colours you use and also the materials you use.	Research and present the difference and similarities between Hunter Gatherers and the Neolithic farming settlement.

Please choose at least 2 projects to complete from above. You should hand in your **FIRST project** on or before **Monday 17th October** and your **SECOND project** on or before **Monday 12th December**. Children will then have time to share their homework with their peers.

These projects give you about six weeks to complete so please make sure you put a lot of effort and thought into your homework. You need to think about how you are going to present your work and make sure you do this to a high standard.

We do not want children completing these the night before they need to be handed in. All of the projects will be displayed in school and photos of the projects will be added to our school website and Facebook page.
