Topic: Minibeats and Growing



Class Teacher: Mrs. Vanessa Kelsall Mrs Chappell (Tuesday & Thursday afternoon) Nursery Leader & Senior Teaching Assistant: Mrs Suzanne Hutchinson

All Reception and Nursery Lessons are taught through the 7 Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Areas of Learning and Development: Prime areas: Communication and Language, (CL) Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED) and Physical Development (PD). The 4 other specific areas are Literacy (L), Mathematics (M), Understanding the World (UW) and Expressive Arts and Design (EAD)

**PSED:** The children reflect on what they have achieved since September. Changes are talked about and made. Regular transition opportunities are made for Reception to experience Year 1. Moving up days included for nursery children too.

Reception— Develop themes explored in Kidsafe sessions including trust, online safety, emotions, yukky feelings and how to keep our bodies safe.

Maths: Older Nursery: Will learn through the theme 'Just Like Me' matching, sorting, comparing and exploring patterns

Reception: White Rose Maths inspired learning through the theme 'First, Now & Then': 'Find My Pattern' and 'On the Move' Exploring number facts, tangrams, doubling, dominoes, odd and even numbers Continue to be challenged with weekly Learn It's and CLICS shared at home

RE: Theme: Special Places: Homes around the World' - Talk and discover the children's special places, St. Michael's church and special places around the world.

Enhancements:

Minipeast hunt Visit a local allotment

Music: Develop musical understanding through the Charanga unit: Reflect, Rewind and Replay

CL: The areas set up around the Classroom will encourage a language rich environment. Opportunities will be given to develop teacher lead learning and real life experiences eg a explorer's Camp and flower shop role play will help the Children re-enact and enrich experiences they may have whilst Camping or when in shops, buying and selling.

All the continuous provision areas in the classroom aim to reflect and encourage speech. The adults in the classroom work in all the areas to question the Children to introduce new Vocabulary inspire learning, developed from the Children's own interests.



UW: Learn about different types of minibeasts, their changes and special features. Observe changes and life cycles of minibeasts and plants eg Caterpillar to butterfly and seed to plant. Plant and grow different types of seeds, bulbs and shrubs and watch and learn how they thrive and grow.

Make a bug hotel, observe and recreate patterns inspired by nature

Ict: Unit Unplugged: Lego building

PD: The children are able to access fine and gross motor activities set out in the indoor and outdoor provision.

Friday PE—Developing skills for Sports Day games

Monday and Friday: Big Toys session

L: Reception take part in daily ELS phonics phase 4 scheme lessons Reading 4 writing simple sentences related to sounds and HRSW learned. The write weekly news and access writing opportunities within the provision areas

Older Nursery—phase 1—blending and segmenting simple words

Key Books: The Very Busy Spider, The Bug
Collector, Butterfly Kiss, The Very Greedy Bee,
The Giant Jam Sandwich, Yukky Worms,
Superworm, Minibeast Madness, Camille and the
Sunflowers, Sam Plants Sunflowers, A
selection of non-fiction minibeast and flower /
plant books.

**EAD:** Focus on Clay sculptures, designing and making Clay minibeasts, learning about how to use Clay.

In the provision there will be opportunities to make junk model Caterpillars, paint and print to make symmetrical butterflies, weave a web and make observational drawings and paintings of minibeasts
