Week 1: Zog and The Flying Doctors Read the stories of Zog by Julia Donaldson. Uisng the children's ideas, set up Zog's clinic role play making links to how to look after our bodies. Make muddy dragons in Outdoor Education with Gary Fitzgerald. Discuss Dinosaurs and find out what the children would like to know about them. Think about similarities between dinosaurs and dragons, fantasy and actual existence. Explore texture and collage, begin to develop simple weaving and sewing techniques. In maths the children will explore the numbers 4,5 an 6. Use computer programmes to colour dinosaurs. Think about how to be safe around fireworks. Week 2: We're going on a Dragon Hunt Read the story of We're Going on a Bear Hunt and use the children's ideas to adapt for a dragon. Go on a dragon hunt with buddies to the park. In maths, we will be learning more about the composition of the numbers 4 and 5. Begin to learn song for the Nativity Performance. Think about Remembrance day and the significance of Poppies. Week 3: Dinosaur Detectives Think about what evidence has been found that tells us dinosaurs lived on Earth. Pretend to be paleontologists with Gary, excavating bones and looking for clues. Look through non fiction texts, think about how these are different to fantasy and stories. Continue to develop weaving and sewing skills. Explore arrangements of 4/5 cubes, one more and one less.
