Things to Remember:

All Reception and Nursery Lessons are taught through the 7 Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Areas of Learning and Development: Prime areas: Communication and Language, (CL) Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED) and Physical Development (PD). The 4 other specific areas are Literacy (L), Mathematics (M), Understanding the World (UW) and Expressive Arts and Design (EAD)

PSED: The children will explore diversity and inclusion in musical, art, dance and IT activities in the whole school 'Friendship Week' during the first week of the term. Through the theme of 'Good to be me' the children will discuss different emotions, feelings and friendships, dreams and goals in circle times. They will be encouraged to show resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge.

Relationships will continue to build with Year 6 buddies on Thursday afternoons. They will explore mental health with Miss Jackson on Friday afternoons.

Maths: Older Nursery:

Learning all about number '2'. recognising, counting, halving, sorting pairs and subitising **Reception:** White Rose Maths inspired learning through the themes, mass, Capacity, composition of 6,7 and 8. Understanding Odd and even, doubles, combining 2 groups, exploring and comparing length To continue and share Big Maths Challenges and targets, weekly, with parents.

RE Theme: Why do people celebrate?'
Appreciate that others may celebrate
differently to us eg The Chinese Spring Festival
Explore the beginning of lent and the
significance of pancakes and Shrove Tuesday.
Think about people who important to us and
who we love and why we may send cards and
gifts of Valentines Day

CL: The areas set up around the classroom will encourage a language rich environment. Opportunities will be given to develop teacher lead learning and real life Experiences. A doctors clinic and restaurant will encourage the children to re-enact scenarios from real life situations as well as make believe.

All the continuous provision areas in the classroom aim to reflect and encourage speech. The adults in the classroom work in all the areas to question the children to introduce new vocabulary inspire learning, developed from the children's own interests and experiences.



UW: The children will explore the theme of real life Superheroes through, thinking of people in the community who help us eg PCO, health visitor and visit to the charity shop.

Explore ways to keep ourselves fit and healthy through food, exercise, sleep, oral hygiene.

Think about ways we can help save the planet by recycling, litter picking. Explore ways of being considerate and caring towards the natural environment.

Learn about how people across the world celebrate differently eg The Chinese Spring Festival.
