All Reception and Nursery Lessons are taught through the 7 Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Areas of Learning and Development: Prime areas: Communication and Language, (CL) Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED) and Physical Development (PD). The 4 other specific areas are Literacy (L), Mathematics (M), Understanding the World (UW) and Expressive Arts and Design (EAD) **PSED:** The children will continue to learn how to keep healthy including ways to help each other when hurt or in need of simple first aid. This will be highlighted in Miss Gorst in PSHE sessions on Friday afternoons.

Ways of showing resilience and perseverance in the face of Challenge are encouraged. The importance of turn taking, waiting politely and tidying up are reinforced.

Relationships will continue to build with Year 6 buddies on Thursday afternoons.

Maths: Older Nursery: Learning all about the number 4, repeating patterns and recognising simple 2D shapes.

Reception: White Rose Maths inspired learning learning through numbers '20 and Beyond through themes including 'How Many Now' and 'Manipulate, Compose & Decompose'

Opportunities will be given to develop teacher lead learning and real life Experiences. A Home Corner and Pirate Ship will encourage the children to re-enact scenarios from real life situations as well as make believe.

All the continuous provision areas in the classroom aim to reflect and encourage speech. The adults in the classroom work in all the areas to question the children to introduce new vocabulary inspire learning, developed from the children's own interests and experiences. Words of the week will help develop children's vocabulary and understanding.



L: Reception take part in daily ELS phonics phase 3 scheme lessons. Reading \Rightarrow writing simple letters and words related to sounds and 'Harder to Read \Rightarrow Spell' words

Older Nursery—phase 1— To Continue to listen for alliteration and initial sounds through games and songs Focus Book for Talk for Writing: Sayeeda and the Pirate Princess

Other Key Books: This is the House that Jack Built, Pirates love Underpants, Commotion in the Ocean, The Pirate Cruncher, The Night Pirates, Port Side Pirates, The Pirates Next Door, The Bad Tempered Ladybird, Non fiction insect / maps / atlas / material / magnetism books. **PD:** The children are able to access fine and gross motor activities set out in the indoor and outdoor provision. **Focus:** painting techniques / Cutting along Curved lines / drawing with increasing detail

PE lessons will include multi skills: striking, fielding, nets and walls, skills. Skills developed with Lucy Potter

(JW: Interactions with the outside world to include a lamb visit and a visit to a local farm, encouraging the children to use their senses to explore the natural world around them, including changes in the environment and animals and their young. Understand the importance of farming in the local community. Develop an understanding of the foods produced in this country to the foods from abroad. Think about what crops and plants need in order to grow.

Discover farm machinery and how farming has changed over time.

EAD: Share and talk about family holidays and places we would like to travel to and why. Explore materials and their properties eg waterproof, float, sink, magnetic, absorbent to discover the best ways of building boats.

Water safety and RNLI importance. Reinforce ways to look after the environment.

Discover how maps work and what they are used for. Plant and grow plants and seeds.

Lifecycles and insects, why pollination is vital

Music: Develop musical understanding through the Charanga topic of Big Bear Funk' Develop a repertoire of songs related to Pirates and insects: When I was One, It's a Pirates Life for me, There's a hole at the bottom of the Sea, Row, Row your Boat, A Sailor Went to Sea, The Big Ship Sails, 12345, This is the House that Jack Built
